Pull Back The Curtain Exodus 25:22

"And behold, the veil of the temple was rent in twain from the top to the bottom and the earth quake did quake and the rocks rent..." (Matthew 27:51)

Why was there a veil? It was there because the Old Testament person could not stand in the Glory of God.

What was the significance of the curtain in the temple being ripped in two when Jesus died? When Christ died that veil was ripped in two symbolizing that there is now free and total access into the presence of God for all regardless of their condition. The veil is torn and now you have free access to God.

Josephus (a first century historian) describes the curtain before the Court of Israel as a beautiful embroidered Babylonian tapestry, mystically depicting the earth, sea, and heavens that typified the universe. The second curtain hung before the unapproachable, inviolable, and invisible Holy of Holies, which was a cubicle some thirty feet square that the high priest entered once a year on the Day of Atonement.

If the veil is ripped then we need to get rid of this spiritual paranoia and the heavy-duty emphasis on works. The only requirement for access comes from the writings of James. "Draw night to God and he will draw night to you." (James 4:8)

The veil was ripped, but before you know it, we get out our needle and thread and start sewing it back. Christ split the veil and then religion and people start sewing it up. For example:

"You can't go into the Holy of Holies because you've not prayed for hours and hours."

"You can't go in there because you're divorced."

"You can't go in there because you don't pray in tongues."

Individually people contribute to this problem by coming to church with their sacrifices, but only as an outward act. Many who make sacrifices leave the church unchanged and unwilling to make their daily life conform to the Word of God.

Leaders also contribute to this problem by taking the Grace of God and turning it into a burden of law-keeping.

Jesus responded to this attitude when he told the Pharisees, "But woe to you scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites because you shut off the kingdom of heaven from men; for you do not enter in yourselves nor do you allow those who are entering to go in." (Matthew 23:13) Religion has kept millions of people throughout church history from what Christ did for them when he split the veil.

You don't change so that you can get in; you get in so that you can change.

We can have the assurance that "We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure. It enters the inner sanctuary behind the curtain where Jesus, who went before us has entered on our behalf."

By tearing the curtain, God himself was showing us a wonderful reality. God wants you!

What Should I Do When I Am Sick?

"Pastor what can I do? For six years I have spent all what I had and I am not healed--all forms of medication have failed. Is there any hope?" On my visit to Mombasa Hospital, a man who had lost his job on the medical grounds asked me this stunning question. A day does not go by without pastors, evangelists, apostles, prophets and even doctors coming across this stunning question.

Many unsatisfactory answers have been given up in response to this question. But the reality is that anybody who is sick needs healing. Does God really heal? If He does heal; then how? And why do people suffer with sickness. "What should I do when I am sick?"

It is a well-known fact that, when a good physician starts to work on a case, the first step is to find out, if possible, the cause of the sickness. Then he works to eliminate that cause. So it is the same when we come to God for healing. We find that He deals not so much with symptoms as with causes. It is important to know the causes of sickness.

Many people have lost confidence in God's promises to heal, failing to understand that there are conditions that must be met before healing can occur. They fail to understand the cause of the sickness and thus fail to receive their healing as per God's Will. Jesus pointed out some very specific reasons for sickness. By checking the Word, those who desire to be healed may understand the causes of sickness and seek solution as provided in the word of God. According to Jesus three sources of sickness will be labelled "Sin, Satan, and for God's glory."

SICKNESS CAUSED BY SIN

First of all Sickness can be a judgment of God upon a person's sin or it can be the result of a person's sin without the source being God. We will, however, be concentrating on the former of these points. God bringing sickness to someone is not a doctrine particularly in vogue today because of an unbalanced view of the Love of God. But, nevertheless, the concept here is a Scriptural one and worthy to be accepted fully, God visits sickness upon individuals and sometimes even entire nations as a response to committed sin that goes un-confessed. The perfect example is seen in John 5:14. There was a man who had been ill for 38 years and was healed by Jesus and had met up with Him a little later on. Jesus said to him "sin no more that nothing worse befall you." The statement of Jesus is quite clear "sin no more" It implies that the cause of sickness was sin. Even if sin hadn't been related to what he'd been healed of, it's definite that Jesus was speaking of a worse condition that he may find himself in if he continued to live in "sin." The intention of Jesus was to make the man realise that sickness cannot be attributed just too consequential forces, but that there's a definite correlation between what we do and what we receive in our own experience.

SICKNESS CAUSED BY SATAN

The second cause of sickness we have labelled is Satan. Sickness can be a work of Satan in the form of a demonic or evil spirit that either oppresses or possesses the individual. So we read in Luke 13:10-17 that the woman who Jesus healed in the synagogue on the Sabbath had been bound for 18 years by Satan. Even though the way Jesus healed, the woman is not in keeping with the normal phenomena that occur at other times of demon expulsion. Jesus simply says "you are freed from your infirmity" and the woman was made whole. We could read more into this than we should but it certainly does appear as if this incident is about satanic oppression rather than possession or, even, about a work of the evil one at some point 18 years previous that had left its scars upon its victim. Whatever the exact reason for the infirmity, the source is definitely Satan and it is not tied up with anything that the woman did that was displeasing to God. Also in Mark 9:14-29 we are given a very classic case of demon possession where the evil spirit is manifesting the incapacity through a child in the form of epilepsy, but it should be noted that it does not follow all forms of epilepsy, but are the result of the presence of an evil spirit. This evil spirit had frequently caused the boy to collapse and to exhibit classic epileptic symptoms Mark 9:17-18, but Jesus commands the spirit to come out of him in Mark 9:25, which it obeys after demonstrating its hold one final time through the child as it leaves. This example is definitely possession.

SICKNESS FOR GOD'S GLORY

For the third cause of sickness, it is good to consider what is recorded in the Gospel of John. As he passed by, he saw a man blind from birth. His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man, or his parents, that he was born blind." The disciples ask Jesus a direct question knowing that Jesus had given answers concerning everything else that had troubled them to resolve the problem in their own minds. Neither this man nor his parents sinned. "Said Jesus, but this happened so that the work of God might be displayed in his life" John 9:1-3. Sometimes people do suffer illness so that God's work must be displayed in their lives. Jesus stops short of saying that God has made him blind in order that He may heal him and ties down his incapacity to neither individual sin for he doesn't forgive the sin in order to bring healing to the man nor the work of Satan for he doesn't rebuke the demonic influence in order that he might receive the healing. The man is born blind simply because that is the way it happened, but God is going to get glory through the naturally occurring event because He is about to heal him. Jesus also perfected the reality of this cause in Bethany. The family of Lazarus had sent a message that he was sick requesting Jesus as a family friend to go and heal his friend. The tarring of Jesus for two more days and his statement in John 11:4 affirm this even more. Jesus said the sickness of Lazarus was not to end in death, but for the glory of God John 11:4.

In conclusion in finding an answer to the question: What can I do when I am sick? Firstly, the most important need is to identify the type of sickness that you are suffering from. Once you have identified the cause, follow Jesus' process of healing as in the Gospels. When Jesus encountered sickness that was a result of sin, He spoke forgiveness to the person as part of the healing process. In Mark 2:5-11, Jesus said two things to the paralytic who was being lowered in through the roof, both of which related to his illness. He said "your sins are forgiven' and 'rise, take up your bed and walk" The forgiveness of his sins was a necessary first step in order that he might be healed because his sickness was sin-related. Once you realize that your sickness is sin related repent and ask Jesus to heal you.

Healing is just at your door step. When He encountered a demonic sickness or those who had been afflicted with sickness; He healed and rebuked the devil Luke 13:10, Mark 9:25. Likewise, In Christ, we have received authority - not just over Satan and his dominion, but over the entire

Creation - to be exercised in accordance with the will of God. There is no technique, only an authoritative word that removes the influence of Satan and brings healing into the situation. We have shown, I believe conclusively, that the three sources of sickness and incapacity have been dealt with by Christ in His work on the cross and through the resurrection and ascension into Heaven. I don't believe that there can be any doubt about what the Bible teaches us and, as you approach the Scriptures, you should be able to affirm that this is the sum total of the matter and the truth that will set you free from sickness.

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The Fabulous Black Woman Speaks? Winter Hair Care

The winter is quickly approaching; which means a change of wardrobe, driving conditions and should mean a change in your hair care regimen. If you were lax in your hair care during the warmer months, you may have survived with minor damage, but if you do not take some serious precautions during the colder months, come Spring, you will definitely regret it. Because the winter months can wreak havoc on your hair, it's very important to choose low maintenance styles so that you do not have to comb or brush often. It's also a great idea to incorporate a routine that causes very little stress on your hair such as letting the hair air dry instead of blow drying it; finger combing the hair instead of using an actual comb; or if you do use a comb, use a wide tooth comb. Also, chose good moisturizing hair care products that do not contain mineral oil, paraffin, petrolatum, SLS or SLES, as all of these cause dryness.

The harsh cold and frosty winds can cause excessive dryness and dandruff, and if you don't retain or replenish the moisture in your hair, damage will soon follow. The best way to combat this is by protecting the hair. During the winter, I never leave out of my house without my hair being covered. I generally wear a satin or silk scarf under my winter hat to preserve the style as well as prevent direct contact with the harsh material most hats are made of.

In the winter, the air becomes extremely dry and harsh; inside and outside. In order to retain moisture in your hair during the day, it is good to use a humidifier to emit humidity in the air inside of your home or office. This will not only combat dry and brittle hair, but can help prevent or minimize dandruff.

Many women opt to wear protective styles during the winter. Protective styles are styles that guard the ends of the hair from the elements; buns, braid extensions, and weaves are a few protective styles to consider. Each of these styles are generally low maintenance, and if maintained properly will allow you to preserve as much of your hair as possible throughout the winter months.

If you choose to wear a bun, it is important to make sure that the hair is not pulled back too tightly, as this may cause stress on the hair line. It is also a good idea to take the bun down every night and lightly mist the ends (about the last 2 inches of hair) with a good moisturizing spray such as, Growth by Sweet Nature by Eddie; and then lock in the moisture with a heavy oil such as castor oil. This will leave the hair super soft, strong and moisturized in the morning.

Braid extensions are also a great choice for winter months. If you follow these simple tips, not only will you preserve your hair, but you will have much stronger, softer and healthier hair come

Spring. If you are going to use synthetic braiding hair such as yaki, kanekelon or other synthetic fibers, it is best if you soak the hair in apple cider vinegar and then rinse in cool water before getting your extensions put in. Synthetic braids come coated with a chemical that causes our hair to become dry; this will strip the chemical away. Another way to reduce dryness is by spraying the hair with a braid spray every day, again the Growth Spray by Sweet Nature is an excellent braid spray. You don't have to drench the hair; a fine mist throughout the extensions will suffice.

Weaves are considered protective only if they are sewn in and your own hair is corn rowed, out of harm's way. In this case, the only thing that is essential to retain moisture is to make sure that it is replenished on a regular basis. Depending on the quality of the weave, it is a good idea to run water through the hair regularly, followed with a good moisturizing spray.

Regardless of which protective style you chose to rock during the winter, it's important to make water your best friend; drink plenty of it and let it run through your hair often. You don't have to shampoo your hair every time you get it wet, but just letting water run through your hair will restore lost moisture. When I wear braid extensions, I let water run through my braid every other day; although I wash them only once a week. I also try to kick up my water intake to no less than sixty or so ounces a day.

The best way of all to combat winter damage is to be proactive. If you start out with your hair strong and healthy before the winter, it will be a lot easier to maintain and preserve during winter. Adopt a weekly routine of washing with a moisturizing shampoo void of SLS and SLES; a good deep conditioner, and good moisturizer that does not contain mineral oil, petrolatum, or paraffin, as these ingredients lead to dryness.

The number nine represents closure [finality]; God is going to bring some finality and closure to some chapters in our lives. You have been sowing seeds and the fruit of your labor shall come forth. If you have exhibited the fruit of the spirit, all nine of the fruits will work together with the fruit (the spirit). There are nine fruit of the spirit (Galatians 5:22-23) and there are nine gifts of the Spirit (1 Corinthians 12:8-10 KJV), all of these will work together to place you in position for what God has for you in 2009. Preparation is the key. To prepare we must:

Increase prayer life - 1 Thessalonians 5:17

Reading and studying God's word - 2 Timothy 2:15.

Endurance - 1 Corinthians 13:7

Giving God praise – Psalms 145:2

Becoming an ambassador for Christ – 2 Corinthian 5:20.

Resisting the devil – James 4:7.

Exercising your authority - Luke 9:1.

Believing God to establish you – 2 Chronicles 20:20

Declaring His works in your life - Psalms 73:48

Note: See NIV for above scriptures.

Your faith has brought you this far so keep the faith and continue to diligently seek him in everything you do — for there is a reward (*Hebrews 11:6 KJV*). 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Christ's Birth

l uke 2:8-20

Once again, the time of year is at hand when the celebration of Christ's birth is upon us. This celebration is called Christmas, which brings several questions to mind, will our celebration be as the heavenly host and shepherds abiding in the fields celebrated with joy or will we celebrate the date, the material gifts, and not the occasion? Will we celebrate with reverential praise for God fulfilling His promise to man by sending us a Savior?

Now that the above questions have been raised for the reader to supply his/her answers, let's look at how God fulfilled all aspects of His promise to humanity. First, He promises the Savior would come from the descendant of Abraham and David. Matthew 1:1-17 traces Christ's genealogy from His earthly father, Joseph's family to those two men thus giving Jesus the proper genealogy that qualified Him to be the Messiah (Genesis 12:3; 22:18; Galatians 3:16 2 Samuel 7:12-19). Luke 3:23-28 traces Jesus' lineage through the males in Mary's genealogy as she was from the lineage of David. The gospel writers attest to both Jesus' legal and biological right to be the Messiah. Second, we see the prophecy of Isaiah 7:14 being fulfilled when it states, "Therefore the Lord himself shall give you a sign; Behold, a Virgin shall conceive, and bear a Son, and shall call his name Immanuel." The name Immanuel means "God with us." Another school of thought on the name "Immanuel"; it gives a deeper meaning to the person coming into God's world is His only begotten Son John 3:16). Third, the prophecy of the Savior being born in a manager because Cesar Augustus issuing tax orders; Joseph and Mary being obedient made the journey to Bethlehem while there; Mary delivered her first born, Jesus Christ.

Now that we have looked at three prophecies being fulfilled, let us explore the importance of Jesus' virgin birth; the redeemer must possess the following qualities, (a) be

fully human, (b) be sinless, and (c) be fully divine; Jesus possessed all three qualities
Hebrews 7:25-26). Let's further explore the requirements that the virgin birth satisfies, (1)
in order for Jesus to be born human was to be born of a woman. Why, because in God's
divine plan for giving birth, He equipped woman for this task. (2) For Jesus to remain sinless
He must be conceived by the Holy Spirit (v20, Hebrews 4:15). (3) In order for Jesus to be
divine was to have God as His Father. This gives rise to His supernatural conception, which
Luke 1:35 states, "that holy thing which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of
God." Therefore, Jesus being both God and man give Him two matures—divine and human.
This brings a question to mind, why were these requirements necessary? First, Jesus living as
a human could sympathize with humanity's weaknesses (Hebrews 4:15-16). Second, Jesus
as the divine Son of God possessed the power to deliver humanity from the bondage of sin
and Satan's clutches (Acts 26:18; Colossians 2:15; Hebrews 2:14; 7:25). Third, Jesus
being both divine and human it qualified Him to serve as the perfect sacrifice for the sins of
the world. Fourth, Jesus as man's high priest intercedes for all humanity that comes to God
through faith (Hebrew 2:9-18; 5:1-9; 7:24-28; 10:4-12).

Now that we have looked at some prophecies being fulfilled as they relate to the birth of Christ, and the reasons why He qualifies as the Messiah as well as the importance of His virgin birth, let us look at the worship services that took place because of His birth. There is the heavenly announcement by the angel of the Lord bringing the good news to the shepherd abiding in the fields tending their flock (sheep). Their statement was "Fear not: behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people." Then the angels gave specific instructions on where to find the baby and what he would be wearing. While this angel was making the announcement, this angel was joined by a "multitude of heavenly host praising God, and saying, Glory to God in the highest, and peace on earth, and good will towards men." These verses have special meaning in that the phrase "great joy" there is no other joy like that of the birth of the promised Savior and all men could rejoice in this celebrated event and what was coming next, and then the heavenly host singing praises to God the peace has finally come to earth. Jesus came to bring peace to all mankind and if the angels in heaven knew the baby Jesus was worthy of their praises, then what about you and me. Others who came to see and worship the baby Jesus were the wise men, who were led by a star from the east. If the angels in heaven can worship Jesus what does this say about man's worship of the Savior?

Closing this discussion, the birth of Christ is the most honored of events that have occurred in recorded history. This is because of who He is and what His birth means to

mankind. His mission was to bring salvation to all men, for this He is worthy of all praises and self scarifying worship.

Finally, take a reflective moment on what Christ's birth, the time mankind celebrates as Christmas really means. Thank God, for sending Your Son on this celebrated day, therefore, let us celebrate this day in its truest meaning.

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Do all Religions Worship the Same God; Gust Under Different Names?

Are all religions valid in that they worship the same God? Why is it that so many people make the statement, "We all worship the same God but under different names?"

Many religious belief systems with different tenets or doctrines around the world contradict the above statement. The statement is contradictory on its premise and violates the discipline of comparative religion. In terms of the deity and nature of a particular deity, the character, and attributes of a particular deity, the particular way a deity accepts worship and how individuals worship that deity, the revealed name of a deity and the concept of meaning of a particular deity. In fact, the statement in and of itself is not even logical.

Can the God of the Bible be worshiped under a different name? Many religious people say "yes" to the aforementioned question. If the answer to this question were an emphatic "yes," then it would be evident and perfectly clear in the scriptures that the Bible teaches such a belief. If a person is honest when he/she examines the Holy writ (The Bible), we will find that the bible does not teach that all religions worship the same God, just only under different names. Having said that, I invite you to read the propositions of Dr. R. A. Morey, to which I whole heartily agree, they are as follow:

- 1) The First Commandment says we are not to worship any other God than the one who has revealed Himself in the Bible (Exodus 20:3-4).
- 2) If all religions worshiped the same God under different names, there would be no idolatry, no false prophets, and no false religions. Yet, the Bible condemns all three. For examples, Jesus warned us about "false prophets" in Matthew 7:15. Yet, if all religions were true, there could be no "false" prophets.
- 3) Throughout biblical history, the worship of Baal, Molech or any other gods of the Fertile Crescent was not viewed as the worship of the God of Israel just under a different name. Any attempt to mix other gods with the God of Israel was condemned by the Prophets and the Apostles. For example, II Corinthians 6:14-17 condemns any attempt to mingle Christ and Baal as if they were the same deity.
- 4) According to Romans 1:18-25, all the gods of other religions were invented by those who rejected the light of natural revelation and created gods in their own image. Thus, pagan religions are not the result of man's search for God, but the result of his running from God!

- 5) The God of the Bible revealed the names by which he wishes to be addressed and worshiped (YHWH, Elohim, Adonai, Theos, Kurios, etc). The Jews were not allowed to make up their own names for God, but were limited to the revealed names.
- 6) Even though some people have speculated that the names of pagan gods such as, Baal may have come from the same basic Semitic linguistic root as Elohim, this does not linguistically, logically, or historically imply that the Jews ever thought that "Baal" was just another name for the God of Israel. While a linguistic root may imply a common deity. The prophets never viewed Baal as the God of Israel because of a shared linguistic stem.
- 7) When the Jews and Christians translated the biblical names for God into other Languages, they never use specific names for specific pagan deities. For example, The Septuagint did not use the Greek name "Zeus" or the Egyptian name "Ra" as a translation for the Hebrew "YHWH" as that would confuse pagan gods with the true God.
- 8) Jews and Christians used generic terms for deity as a translation for the names of God found in the Hebrew and Greek Bible. Thus, YHWH was translated as <u>Theos</u> and <u>Kurios</u> in the Septuagint and the New Testament.
- 9) The use of a generic term for "deity" in a foreign language translation of the Bible neither logically nor historically implies that the translator believed that the God of the Bible was synonymous with any god that was designated by the same generic terms. Thus, the use of Theos as a translation of Elohim did not logically imply that the Jews believed that Zeus or some other Greek god was the God of the Bible.
- 10) The fact that the Jews and Christians would translate the names of God into different Languages long after the Bible was completed does not logically imply that pagan gods who shared the same generic terms were viewed as being the God of the Bible.
- 11) In logic, a formal similarity in name does not imply a substantial agreement in concept. For example, all major pagan religions such as, Hinduism and cults such as Jehovah's Witnesses and Mormons use the English word "God" when referring to the deity. Yet, while they use the same English word for deity that Christians use, they do not worship the Same God that Christians worship.
- 12) The God of the Bible is not a vague "thing" that can be defined any way you please. The true God has revealed prepositional facts about Himself in the Bible. For example, the God revealed in the Bible is a personal, infinite, and triune being of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and any concept of "God" that is less than that is not true according to the Bible.

Lastly, since all religions contradict each other on essential concepts such as God, man, sin and salvation, either one religion is true and all the others are false or they all are false. But they cannot logically all be true.

Conclusion, No matter how you look at it, the idea that all religions worship the same God just under different names is a very ignorant and foolish belief. It contradicts logic, history and the science of comparative religion. It is actually an insult to the major religions of this world, which have very carefully defined their concept of deity, so as to distinguish their god from all other gods. Jesus is Lord! Maranatha!..... Shalon!

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What's Blocking Your Fruit?

In Matthew 13: 5-9, Jesus told a parable of a barren fig tree. The English Standard Version of the Holy Bible states thus, "And he told this parable: A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard, and he came seeking fruit on it and found none. And he said to the vinedresser, 'Look, for three years now I have come seeking fruit on this fig tree, and I find none. Cut it down. Why should it use up the ground?' And he answered him, 'Sir, let it alone this year also, until I dig around it and put on manure. Then if it should bear fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down."'

Initially, this parable perplexed me. The compassionate, loving Jesus I serve, it seemed, would have pity on the barren tree. Was it the tree's fault that it didn't/couldn't make figs? Was it only valuable if it bore fruit? Couldn't it be appreciated for the shade it provided and appreciated as a sanctuary for birds? Why would Jesus allow the poor barren fig tree to be cut down?

After considering the fate of the tree in this parable, the meaning became clearer. We are all fig trees, and the figs are our individual gifts. Jesus wants us to know He <u>expects</u> us to grow and use our gifts for the edification of the Body of Christ. He will allow us time to get help and correction, He understands our struggles, but when that time is up, we have to either bear fruit or get cut down. According to the parable, there is no compromise! So, it is time to get serious about bearing fruit, Saints!

As a Christian Therapist, I see my charge as that of the vinedresser, to help Christians dig around their roots and expose the pain that is blocking spiritual growth and maturity. We must get to the root cause of your pain—the neglect, abuse, or lack of proper boundaries you experienced as a child, the lies you were told as a child and still believe, issues from a fear of abandonment, issues from a fear of being judged, criticized or ridiculed, the guilt or shame of events from your past, and all the other unresolved issues that you keep hidden in the recesses of your heart and mind. Many of us feel safe using the "get over it" approach to resolving our pain. However, by not dealing with the issues and trying to just forget about them, it robs us of the lessons that God was trying to teach us by allowing us to endure the suffering. No wonder we aren't bearing fruit!

Once we find the root of your pain, the power of the Holy Spirit and the Word of God can bring about healing and reconcile you to the unconditional love of God through his beloved Son, Jesus Christ. Then, and only then, can we bear the fruit Jesus spoke of in the parable and use our gifts to the glory of God!

We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God." (NIV)

Being a Kingdom woman means I have stopped feeling badly about being a woman, and have stopped apologizing for it. Too many of us feel badly because we are female: our fathers wanted a boy, our mothers treated our brothers differently than they treated us, our families wanted a namesake, or maybe we just feel like we never quite measured up to the expectations of others. Not only did many of us feel second best in our families, we also felt second best when we measured ourselves against other women: we weren't as pretty, as smart, as thin, as talented, as gifted, or as "perfect" as someone else was. Thank God, we have the cross, which in the light of it, the expectations of others grow dim and irrelevant. I now realize that no matter what someone else might have or be, I don't have to feel badly because that is not what I have or who I am. Whatever I may lack, God will, "... equip you with everything good for doing His will, and may He work in us what is pleasing to Him, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory for ever and ever." (Hebrews 13:20-22, NIV)

Being a Kingdom woman means I am assured of my calling in Christ. I do not feel compelled to hide it, nor do I feel guilty for it. I know I have this ministry by the gift of God, not by my works or by my abilities in the flesh. By operating in God's gift of ministry, I can clearly see and acknowledge that God is working in me, and not me; myself. The call I have is from God, not from man; and I realize that whatever man may do to me, the call God has given to me cannot be taken away, as "... God's gifts and His call are irrevocable." (Romans 11:29, NIV)

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Debt FREE Living Principles

Living a Debt FREE life is not only possible it is commanded. For the remainder of the year we will give you the principles out of God's Word that supports this idea.

Principle #7 Save Consistently

"Steady plodding brings prosperity." Proverbs 21:5 (LB)

Today's lesson is a detailed description of the 20 percent in the 70-20-10 Rule.

70-20-10 Rule

70% - operational

20% - savings, investments, or debt payoff

10% - tithes

Now that you know the impact of the 10 percent on the 100 percent, we will move towards the impact of the 20 percent. The richest man that ever lived (Solomon) tells us in Proverbs 21:5 that if we are consistent in our saving and investing that it will bring prosperity.

Most people spend and then save. If there is anything left after they have spent, they save. The 70-20-10 Rule teaches the reverse. The 70-20-10 Rule teaches to give God His 10 percent first, save and invest 20 percent, and then figure out how to live off the 70 percent.

If you are in debt, pay your debt off first, then start saving and investing. In the months ahead, we will explore this further. The only exception to this rule is if you are in an employer, savings plan where there is employer matching.

Outside of that, the rules used to eliminate debt are the same rules needed to stay out of debt. These principles will give you more monies so you can consistently save and invest.

Let's take a look at our millionaire flow example.

If you average \$25,000 a year and work 40 years, you will have earned \$1 Million in your working lifetime.

Where does it all go?

37% to 50% to taxes

20% to home mortgage interest

10% to other credit interest

Only 20% to 33% for you!

That's \$8,250/yr...\$687/mo...\$159/wk for you to live on!

It's not how much you make that makes you financially sound; it's how much you get to keep.

Eliminating or reducing the amounts taken in taxes, mortgage interest, and other credit interest will greatly increase the monies available for consistent saving and investing. In his book, Freedom of Simplicity, Richard Foster, suggests 10 keys to reducing expenses:

- 1 Buy things for their usefulness rather than their status.
- 2 Reject anything that is producing an addiction in you.
- 3 Develop a habit of giving things away.
- 4 Refuse to be propagandized by the custodians of modern gadgetry.
- 5 Learn to enjoy things without owning them.
- 6 Develop a deeper appreciation for the creation.
- 7 Look with healthy skepticism at all "buy now, pay later" schemes.
- 8 Obey Jesus' instructions about plain, honest speech.
- 9 Reject anything that breeds the oppression of others.
- 10 Shun anything that distracts you from seeking first the kingdom of God.

The 20 percent portion of the 70-20-10 Rule works due to being steady and consistent. To become steady and consistent, you must learn how to live within your means.

"Steady plodding brings prosperity." Proverbs 21:5 (LB)

The Bible Series of Study (Part 1)

Teaching Objective

The student will have a better understanding and appreciation of the Bible, the purpose for which it was given to man and the benefits that one can get from studying and obeying the Word of God.

Introduction

The Word of God – the Holy Bible – is God's special book. It is not like other books, but is a supernatural book. It is God's written word for man. God used more or less forty human authors from all walks of life to compose and record HIStory, through the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Writers were inspired by God.

The Bible is the world's bestseller. This last year there were more Bibles bought than any other book. The Bible is also one of the oldest books in the world. The most ancient portions of the Bible date back almost 4,000 years. Yet it is still the most modern and relevant book in the world

today, for in it we find the answer to life's greatest questions: "Where did I come from? Why am I here? Where will go?"

Even though the Bible contains, 66 smaller books, it has one central theme: God's plan to rescue mankind.

The Bible is divided into two major sections, the OLD TESTAMENT (OT) and the NEW TESTAMENT (NT). The OT, with 39 books, talks about the history prior to the birth of Jesus Christ, while the NT, with 27 books, focuses on the life of Jesus and the events that followed after His resurrection.

The Bible is the only book that has been translated into all the major languages of the world. It was originally written in three languages – Hebrew, Aramaic, and Greek. Dedicated Bible scholars translated the Bibles that are available today, so we can have the Word of God in our modern language. Various versions have made it easier for us to understand the Bible.

Studying the Bible

The most vital relationship in life is with God. Through reading and studying the Bible, we come to understand what God is like – His thoughts, His Will, His Ways, His Plans and His promises. The index in front of the Bible will show us how to find the part of the Bible quoted. For example, Genesis 3:15 would mean the book of Genesis, chapter three and verse fifteen.

In Acts 2, Peter preached to the thousands of people gathered in Jerusalem and 3,000 men responded to his message that day. One of the descriptions about their conversions was that they devoted themselves to the Apostle's teaching ... (verse 42).

What are the Apostles' Teaching?

The apostles put their teaching into writing – the NT. The NT interprets the OT, so the apostles' teaching is the WHOLE WORD OF GOD – the Bible.

The Word of God Produces Life

"The Spirit gives life; the flesh counts for nothing. The words I have spoken to you are spirit and they are life" (John 6:63).

It is also creative.

"By the word of the LORD were the heavens made, their starry host by the breath of his mouth. He gathers the waters of the sea into jars; he puts the deep into storehouses. Let all the earth fear the LORD; let all the people of the world revere him. For he spoke, and it came to be; he commanded, and it stood firm" (Psalm 33:6-9).

"By faith we understand that the universe was formed at God's command, so that what is seen was not made out of what was visible" (Hebrews 11:3)

The Word of God is Like Water

It cleanses.

We start life in the Kingdom of God totally washed clean by the Word of God.

"You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you" (John 15:3)

"Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her ²⁶ to make her holy, cleansing her by the washing with water through the word, ²⁷ and to present her to

himself as a radiant church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and blameless" (Ephesians 5:25-27).

It keeps clean.

The Word of God, planted in our hearts, keeps us free from sin.

"How can a young man keep his way pure? By living according to your word. ¹⁰ I seek you with all my heart; do not let me stray from your commands. ¹¹ I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you" (Psalm 119:9-11).

The Word of God is Light for Our Lives

"And we have the word of the prophets made more certain, and you will do well to pay attention to it, as to a light shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts" (2 Peter 1:19)

It gives understanding in a dark world.

"The precepts of the LORD are right, giving joy to the heart. The commands of the LORD are radiant, giving light to the eyes" (Psalm 19:8).

"Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path ... the unfolding of your words gives light; it gives understanding to the simple" (Psalm 119:105,130).

The Word of God is Spiritual Food

"Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Man does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God" (Matthew 4:4).

It causes spiritual growth.

"Brothers, I could not address you as spiritual but as worldly—mere infants in Christ. ² I gave you milk, not solid food, for you were not yet ready for it. Indeed, you are still not ready" (1 Corinthians 3:1-2).

"Like newborn babies, crave pure spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow up in your salvation ..." (1 Peter 2:2).

God's aim for each of us is expressed in Ephesians 4:12-15. "... to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up ¹³ until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ."

The Word of God is Seed

In Luke 8:14-15, Jesus told his disciples the parable of the Soils. In verse 11, he said: "The seed is the Word of God." God's will for our lives is fruitfulness. (See Psalm 1:3).

"Now he who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will also supply and increase your store of seed and will enlarge the harvest of your righteousness" (2 Corinthians 9:10).

The Word of God is Like a Sword

"Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God" (Ephesians 6:17)

"For the word of God is living and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart" (Hebrews 4:12).

Note how Jesus used the "Sword of the Spirit" against Satan during His temptation in the wilderness.

Luke 4:1-14, "Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the desert, ² where for forty days he was tempted by the devil. He ate nothing during those days, and at the end of them, he was hungry. ³ The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to become bread." ⁴ Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Man does not live on bread alone." ⁵ The devil led him up to a high place and showed him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. ⁶ And he said to him, "I will give you all their authority and splendor, for it has been given to me, and I can give it to anyone I want to. ⁷ So if you worship me, it will all be yours." ⁸ Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Worship the Lord your God and serve him only." ⁹ The devil led him to Jerusalem and had him stand on the highest point of the temple. "If you are the Son of God," he said, "throw yourself down from here. ¹⁰ For it is written:

"He will command his angels concerning you to guard you carefully; "they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone."

¹² Jesus answered, "It says: 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test." ¹³ When the devil had finished all this tempting, he left him until an opportune time."

The Word of God Helps Us to Pray

"Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. ²⁵ The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock. ²⁶ But everyone who hears these words of mine and does not put them into practice is like a foolish man who built his house on sand. ²⁷ The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell with a great crash" (Matthew 7:24-27).

Jesus said that the wise man who built his house on the rock was a picture of those who **hear** His Word and **obey** it. The Word of God builds inner concrete within our lives so that no matter what may come against us we will stand strong.

Final Thought: In 2 Timothy 3:15-16, Apostle Paul reminded young Timothy about the purpose of the Word of God. He said, "and how from infancy you have known the holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. ¹⁶ All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting, and training in righteousness."

Apostle Peter also explained, "His divine power has given us everything we need for life and godliness through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness. ⁴ Through these he has given us his very great and precious promises, so that through them you may participate in the divine nature and escape the corruption in the world caused by evil desires."


